Wing-Commander B. W. Hopkins has returned from overseas after active service in the R.C.A.F. since 1940 and has now resumed his law practice.

While serving in Canada, he is employed as assistant judge advocate-general of Eastern Air Command and No. 1 Training Command, and while overseas was assistant judge advocate-general for the R.C.A.F. in the Middle East, Mediterranean and Italy, and latterly, while deputy judge advocate-general of R.C.A.F. overseas acted as judge-advocate on courts-martial on the Continent.

Wing-Commander Hopkins was an operational pilot in World War I, in the Royal Flying Corps and Royal Air Force, having served in the Middle East and Italy, and by coincidence saw service in the same areas and territories in World War II.

Wing-Commander Hopkins was made a King's Counsel in the year 1933, and served for a few years on the Hamilton City Council and as a controller.
