

COL. M'INTOSH REPRIMANDED

London, Ont., Sept. 24 (CP).—Lieut.-Col. Norman Allen McIntosh, chief instructor at the Canadian Army Driving and Maintenance School (S-5), Woodstock, Saturday was sentenced "to be severely reprimanded" by a general courtmartial. He was charged in connection with an incident occurring at the Woodstock Centre June 28, in which Col. McIntosh is said to have engaged in a struggle with a corporal in the officers' mess:

At a courtmartial held at Woodstock Aug. 1-3, Col. McIntosh was found not guilty on a charge of "ill treating" Cpl. W. J. Sillers of Woodstock, and guilty on an alternative charge of "conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline."

Col. McIntosh was represented at the general courtmartial here by Col. W. G. Kerr of Chatham, former judge advocate-general of Military District No. 1 (London).
