

RADIOS FOR HOME WILL BE CUT OFF

Production Soon To Be Halted Until War Is Over

Ottawa, April 25. -- Warning to Canadians that production of household radios will cease for the war's duration as soon as pre-fabricated parts still being assembled by radio manufacturers are used up was issued last night by Supplies Controller Alan H. Williamson.

He said the pre-fabricated parts will "probably be used up before the year is over."

Mr. Williamson listed these suggestions for prolonging the life of radio sets:

Keep your radio at least an inch away from the wall--tubes, transformers and resistors heat up, and free circulation of air is necessary to prevent overheating.

Check the connecting plug of the radio and the wire leading to the plug. Check the wires and plugs for all electrical appliances, making sure all connections are snug. Check electric bulbs--loose connections cause static.
